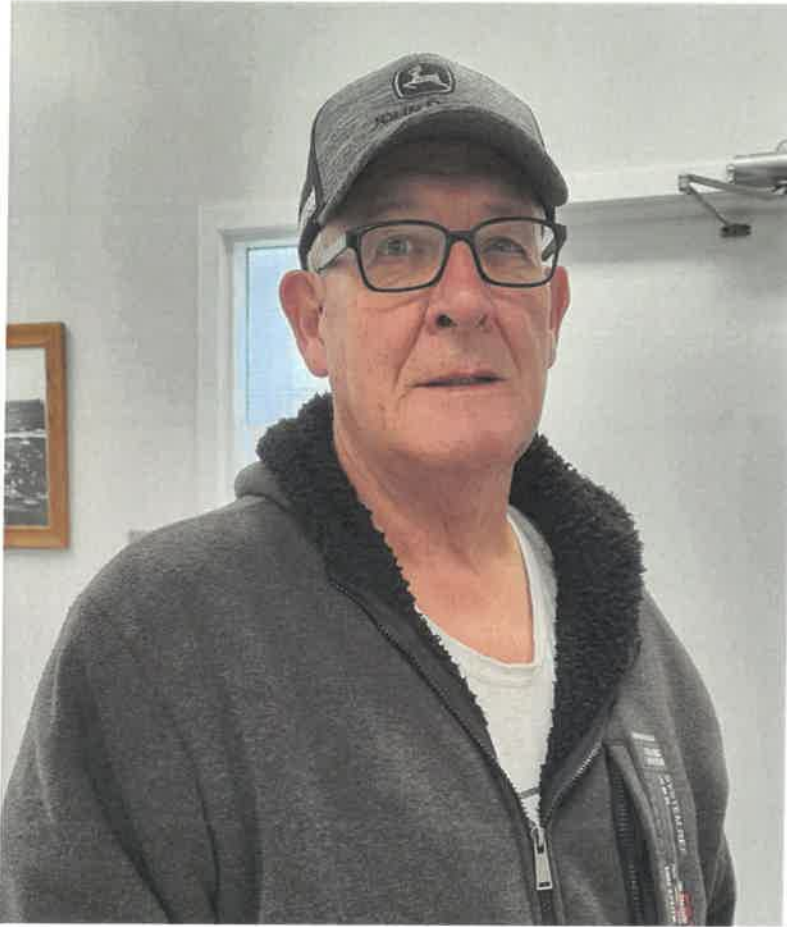

My name is Curt Orth and I am a retired Potash worker. I am married and have a big, growing family.

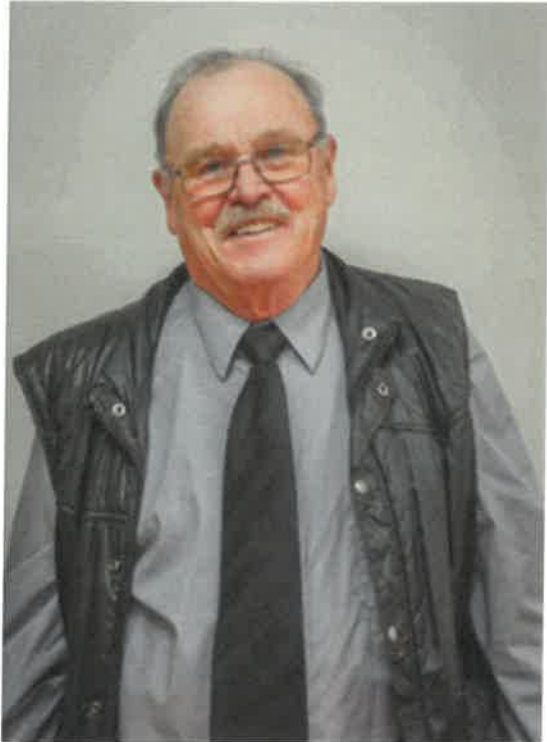
I have lived in the area all of my life, first on farmland and now in town.
