PROVINCIAL & REGIONAL PARKS

Langenburg is surrounded by beautiful provincial and regional parks that are full of activities all year round! Go and explore them!

- **Assessippi Provincial Park** (25 min. drive) is situated at the south end of Lake of the Prairies, a man-made lake flanked by the magnificent valley walls of the Assiniboine and Shell rivers. The lake has one of the largest walleye fisheries in the area. The Park includes a large campground with over 100 mostly serviced sites and a new playground;
- **Ski Area & Resort** - the best snow sports facility from Thunder Bay to Calgary. **Winter** activities include skiing, snowboarding, downhill snow tubing & snow-shoeing with a full rental fleet. **Summer** activities include: a dance camp, banquets & weddings, kayak rentals, mountain biking trails and Trans Canada trail Visit www.assessippi.ca;
- **The Carlton Trail Regional Park** (15 min drive) is a family recreation and activity center that features a nine-hole golf course, a stocked fishing lake, a public beach, camping facilities with 75 electrical sites as well as food services, a picnic area, playground, ball diamonds and hiking trails.
- In 1.5 - 2 hour drive you will find beautiful Good Spirit Provincial Park, Riding Mountain National Park and Duck Mountain Provincial Park!
