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
INTRODUCTION

This emergency plan is to provide guidance to respond to an emergency affecting the Town of Langenburg and/or the R.M. of Langenburg.

This document is intended to aid in providing a prompt and coordinated response, thereby reducing human suffering and loss or damage to property.

The elected officials will direct and control emergency operations at all times through the implementation of this plan.

This plan may be implemented in whole or in part, with or without a Declaration of Local Emergency. Use of the Emergency Powers found in Section 21 of the Emergency Planning Act, 1989, requires a Local Emergency to be declared.

DEFINITIONS

Emergency

An Emergency is an abnormal situation that demands prompt, coordinated actions that exceed normal procedures, thereby limiting damage to person, property and/or the environment.

Emergency Coordinator

That person appointed by resolution as the Emergency Coordinator for the Town of Langenburg and the R.M. of Langenburg No. 181.

Local Authority

Means the Council of the Municipality.

Municipal Service

Means fire, police, ambulance, public works and other agencies operating within the jurisdiction of the Town of Langenburg and the R.M. of Langenburg.

Resource

Means personnel, equipment and operational supplies available for use during a period of emergency.

Emergency Plan

Purpose

The purpose of this emergency plan is to provide for a prompt and coordinated response to emergencies affecting either the Town of Langenburg or the R.M. of Langenburg No. 181.

Exception

This emergency plan does not apply to those day to day situations which can be handled by the municipality services on their own.

Authority

This emergency plan is authorized in accordance with Bylaw No. 141 of the Town of Langenburg dated the 9th day of January, 1978.

This emergency plan is authorized in accordance with Bylaw No. 2-87 of the R.M. of Langenburg No. 181 dated the 13th day of January, 1987.

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Upon receipt of a warning of a real or potential emergency, that person will immediately contact one of the individuals listed under the Community Warning Sections Emergency Notification.

It is the responsibility of the members of the Emergency Operations Center Management Team to notify their staff and volunteer organizations. **The Emergency Operations Center Management Teams phone numbers are under the warning section.**

Where a threat of an impending emergency exists, the Emergency Operations Center; Management Team will be notified and placed on alert. The Emergency Coordinator or designate may open the Emergency Operation Center in order to coordinate the response to the emergency and/or coordinate public information.

IMPLEMENTATION

This emergency plan may be implemented in whole or in part, when an emergency exists or may exist.

When the Local Authority is satisfied that an emergency exists or may exist in all or any part of the municipality, It may be resolution make a local emergency declaration relating to all or any part of the municipality.

Where it is not possible to assemble a sufficient number of members of the local authority, a member of the local authority may make a local emergency declaration on behalf of the local authority.

Immediately after making a local emergency declaration, the details of the declaration must be published by any means of communication that is considered most likely to make those details known to the majority of the population of the area affected by the declaration.

Immediately on the making the declaration, a copy of the declaration must be forwarded to the minister.

In the event of an emergency, this emergency plan can be implemented without declaring a local emergency.

In any emergency, call **Saskatchewan Public Safety & Sask 911 at (306)787-9563**, who will in turn, notify provincial departments and agencies.

TERMINATION

A local emergency declaration expires at the end of seven days from the time the declaration was made (to the minute) unless it is earlier renewed.

When in the opinion of the local authority, an emergency no longer exists or it is in the public interest, the local authority shall terminate the local emergency declaration.

The details of the termination must be published by any means of communication

that is considered most likely to make those details known to the majority of the population of the area affected by the declaration. Immediately on making the termination, a copy of the termination must be forwarded to the minister.

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Emergency Operations Center Management Team will direct and control the response to the emergency. The Emergency Operations Center Management Team will be responsible for providing essential services and resources to the community and to the Emergency Site Team. The Emergency Operations Center Management Team will consist of the following:

Municipal Administrator, Emergency Coordinator, Transportation Manager, R.C.M.P. or Designate, Resources Manager, Fire Chief or Alternate, Assistant Municipal Administrator, Health Services, Public Information Manager, Emergency Social Services Director, Human Resources/Volunteer Manager, Telecommunications Manager.

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER

The Emergency Operations Center Management Team will report to the Emergency Operations Center located at the Town Office, #202 Wells Avenue E. In the event that this operation center cannot be used, then the secondary location will be the Town Shop, #619 Road Avenue E.

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER MANAGEMENT TEAMS RESPONSIBILITIES

- Calling out municipal emergency services in response to the emergency.
- Confirming the appointment of the Emergency Site Manager (in consultation with the Council and/or Mayor/Reeve). All responding emergency services must be informed of the appointment.
- Determine if the location of the Emergency Operations Center is appropriate.
- Consult with the Emergency Site Manager and the Council and/or Mayor/Reeve to determine if a Declaration of Local Emergency is required. The Declaration of Local Emergency when properly conducted must be submitted to Sask Public Safety and Sask 911.
- Providing adequate communications from the Emergency Operations Center to the Emergency site (radio, telephone, message runners).
- Establish/confirm public inquiry phone numbers.
- Determine whether an evacuation of residents is required. Overseeing that the needs of the evacuated residents are being met.
- Discontinuing of utilities or services provided by public or private concerns i.e. power, water, gas, closing down stores, schools, etc.
- Implementing mutual aid arrangements with neighboring communities.
- Determine if volunteers are needed.
- Determine if transportation is required for evacuation of persons or the moving of supplies.
- Ensure that the residents of the community are updated on the response to the emergency.

- Expend monies as authorized to deal with the emergency.
- Notify the response personnel and residents of the termination of the local emergency.
- Submit Termination of Local Emergency form to Sask Public Safety and Sask 911.
- Maintain a log of all activities and decisions made and submitting all records to the Emergency Coordinator.
- After the emergency, conduct a review of emergency response procedures and make amendment to the emergency plan where required.

EMERGENCY POWERS

Emergency powers may only be used after a Local Emergency has been declared. The Council may do all acts and take all proceedings that are reasonably necessary to meet the emergency. Section 21 of the Emergency Planning Act, 1989.

ORGANIZATION AND CONTROL

Council and Mayor/Reeve

The Council and in the absence of a quorum of Council, the Mayor/Reeve will control and direct the emergency operations at all times. In the absence of Council, the Mayor/Reeve will assume responsibility of directing emergency operations.

Municipal Administrator

- Advise the Council and Mayor/Reeve on legislation and procedures and of developments to the emergency situation and response.
- Manage and coordinate Emergency Operations Center Management Team activities.
- Manage and coordinate the emergency response.
- Maintain financial and other records pertaining to the emergency operations.

Emergency Coordinator

- Ensure that the EOC is set up.
- Assist administrator in all duties.
- Coordinate post-emergency reporting and preparation of all reports.
- Shall ensure amendments to the emergency plan are made.

Telecommunications Manager

- Ensure reliable and secure telecommunications are established between the Emergency site and the Emergency Operations Center.
- Coordinate communications procedures.
- Arrange for additional communications resources with SaskTel and other public and private agencies and/or organizations.

Transportation Manager

- Develop and maintain a Transportation Resource List of various vehicles and their capacities.
- Coordinate the transportation of personnel and materials.
- Vehicles for evacuation

Emergency Social Services Director

- Develop and maintain Evacuation and Reception Resource Lists.
- Coordinate and develop evacuation and reception arrangements with neighboring municipalities.
- Arrange for food, lodging, personal services, clothing, registration and inquiry services.

Human Resources/Volunteers Manager

- Develop and maintain listing of volunteer organizations and/or people.
- Liaise with other government agencies to help coordinate volunteer activities in an emergency.
- Maintain listing of human resources.

Resources Manager

- Develop and maintain resource listings of equipment.
- Coordinate the utilization of these resources in an emergency.

Public Information Manager

- Develop timely media releases concerning the emergency for release to radio stations, television, and newspapers, pending approval for the EMO coordinator and/or the elected officials.
- Deliver media briefings or brief the community's official spokesperson.

Clerks and Staff

- Perform all duties as may be assigned by the Municipal Administrator/EMO coordinator.

EMERGENCY SITE MANAGEMENT TEAM

Emergency Site Manager

- Manage and control the Emergency Site Operations
- Keeps the Emergency Operations Center informed of all operation activities and resource requirements at the site.
- Determines the inner and outer perimeter of the emergency site.

Police

In addition to their normal day to day duties, the police will provide:

- The Emergency Site Manager, unless circumstances dictate otherwise.
- Security at the emergency site.
- A temporary morgue is required, and
- Assist in the evacuation of people.

Fire Services

In addition to their normal day to day duties, the fire service will provide:

- The Emergency Site Manager, unless circumstances dictate otherwise.
- Assist in the evacuation of people, and
- Initiation of Mutual Fire Aid if required.

Emergency Medical Services

In addition to their normal day to day duties, ambulance service will provide:

- The Emergency Site Manager, unless circumstances dictate otherwise.
- Casualty evaluation
- First aid on site, and
- Casualty sorting and transportation.

1. Public information – The public information manager in consultation with the Mayor/Reeve will advise CJGX Radio and CTV Television that an emergency exists and will confirm arrangements for the dissemination of information to the citizens and general public.
2. Media information – The Mayor/Reeve or designated officer will authorize all information to be released to the News.
3. Records – all communication, correspondence and activities will be recorded and retained for future reference.

Communications

1. The Communications Manager will arrange for communications via 2-way radio between the emergency site and emergency operations center.
2. Where existing telephone service is or may be adequate, the communications manager will arrange with Sask Tel for the immediate installation of additional telephones for use by the Emergency Operations Center for the duration of the emergency.
